Misty Romero's first alternative break trip was to Juarez, Mexico during Spring Break of her sophomore year at Colorado College. She stayed involved with alternative breaks throughout her college career and served on the Break Away Board of Directors from 1997-2003.

Misty's passion is to make a contribution to improving health care and to increasing the general knowledge that people have about their bodies and their health. For many years Misty participated in the Chicago Women's Health Center collective in Chicago. She continues to provide health education along with sensitive, educational, empowering, and affordable health care as a Registered Nurse in a community health clinic that primarily provides care to gay, lesbian, bisexual, and transgender individuals as well as HIV positive individuals. Misty is still a regular donor to the alternative break movement.
