

You'll be responsible for:

Building a team — virtually!

Part of the joy of the ABCs has always been the opportunity to connect with alternative breakers and active citizens from colleges and universities across the country. We're looking for Team Leaders who are excited to help us build that community virtually — facilitating team and relationship building with their small group of 15-20 participants, as well as facilitating community time and caucuses.

Connecting with a co-leader

Each Team Leader will be paired with another co-leader to lead their team of 15-20 participants. Team Leader pairs are expected to invest time outside of scheduled Team Leader trainings to get to know each other and build their partnership.

Facilitating small group discussions

The ABCs is jam-packed with content that challenges us all to think about alternative break programming in new ways. Throughout each day, participants will have space with their team to process and reflect on what they've learned and how it applies to their role back on campus. Team Leaders will be given broad outlines for these discussions with sample questions and activities, but are encouraged to bring their own creativity. In addition, Team Leaders should be prepared to gauge the needs of the group and adapt their plans accordingly — using group builders, grounding activities, and other facilitation techniques as needed. We anticipate Team Leaders will need to dedicate an additional 1 hour/day outside of the ABCs schedule to prep with their co-leader.

Liaising with the Break Away staff

The Break Away staff relies on Team Leaders to be the first line of communication with the participants on their team, helping them navigate the conference schedule and format. Team Leaders will attend a 30 minute meeting before the first workshop to check-in on each group and run through the schedule for the day. Team Leaders also help our staff understand when participants might need 1:1 follow-up, either personal or programmatic.

We're looking for:

- Current students (undergraduate or graduate) or recent graduates who are passionate about community and social justice

It's helpful if:

- You're comfortable facilitating discussions on Zoom
- You have experience leading small groups
- You have experience with alternative breaks or other community engagement activities, either virtual or in-person

You'll get:

- A **free** registration to the ABCs (a \$300 value)
- The opportunity to connect with a cohort of student leaders from across the country
- One day of virtual facilitation training with the Break Away staff — currently scheduled for June 5 (session 2) or July 10 (sessions 3 and 4)
